



Today's good news

Today is the **Commemoration of the All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)**. The Church, after celebrating the feast of All Saints, today prays for all who, in the purifying suffering of Purgatory, await the day they will join in heavenly glory. The celebration of the Mass, which re-presents the Sacrifice of Christ on Calvary, has always been the principal means by which the Church fulfills the great responsibility of charity toward the dead. Death cannot break the bonds of the Body of Christ. —Daily Roman Missal

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

"The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned.

Daily in a special Memento in the Canon of the Mass, at which the priest remembers all those who have fallen asleep in the Lord, the priest implores God to grant them a place of happiness, light and peace. Thus there is no Mass in which the Church does not pray for the faithful departed; but today her thoughts are directed towards them in a particular fashion, with the maternal preoccupation of leaving no soul in Purgatory without spiritual aid and of grouping them all together in her intercession. By a privilege that Benedict XV's decree has extended to the whole world every priest can today celebrate three Masses; for the liberation of the souls in Purgatory the Church multiplies the offering of the sacrifice of Christ, from which she draws forever on behalf of all her children, infinite fruits of redemption.

Even when November 2 falls on a Sunday, the Mass celebrated is that from the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.

We pray for the Faithful Departed especially during the "octave" of All Souls, from November 1st to the 8th.

All Saints' Day

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven.

All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Parthenon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints.



All Soul's Day

On this day is observed the commemoration of the faithful departed, in which our common and pious Mother the Church, immediately after having endeavored to celebrate by worthy praise all her children who already rejoice in heaven, strives to aid by her powerful intercession with Christ, her Lord and Spouse, all those who still groan in purgatory, so that they may join as soon as possible the inhabitants of the heavenly city."

In some restaurants it's hard to keep employees. People apply, say they want to work, joyfully accept the job, and then start. Soon they find out why it's called "work". Potential employees like the idea of working around food and people, but many of them don't last. They come and go.

Workers who stick around long enough to learn the business and the customers have exceptional value. Until they retire. Or go on disability. Or, God forbid, die.


Nothing is permanent. Even the most valued people in our lives leave. Others step in to take their place. Some do nicely. Some don't. They never fully replace the loss of someone we admired.

The Letter to the Hebrews acknowledges this situation among Levitical priests in the Old Testament. "They were prevented by death from remaining in office." There had to be many priests from one generation to the next, because no priest was permanent.

Until Jesus. "Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away." He lives forever to make intercession for us. He is always on the job. He helps us in time of need. We will come and go, but Jesus lives forever.
